WHAT IS THE AMERICAN EYE STUDY CLUB?

Established in the late-1950s by young ophthalmologists who would become distinguished figures in ophthalmology (Thomas Hedges, Thomas Kearns, Howard Naquin, Edward Norton, and Albert Ruedemann, Jr.), the American Eye Study Club was created to serve as a forum for young leaders in our profession from diverse academic and geographic backgrounds to openly exchange ideas and discuss new developments in ophthalmology in a scientific and social setting that included spouses and families. Active membership was limited to ten years so that the Club would remain fresh and vibrant and evolve in concert with our profession. However, Emeritus members have contributed to the Club's sense of tradition through continued involvement in the Club's Annual Meetings and gatherings at the American Academy of Ophthalmology.

As subspecialization has become more common in ophthalmology, the American Eye Study Club has remained a setting in which comprehensive ophthalmologists and representatives of numerous subspecialties may share information and ideas that keep all of us abreast of what is happening in our specialty as a whole. Just as importantly, this information is shared in an informal environment that engenders a strong sense of camaraderie. Over the years, the Club has evolved with the changes in our profession but has also developed such traditions as the Baptismo Emeritus, which was "introduced" by Ed Isbey, Jr. at the 10th Annual Meeting at the Cocoa Palms Resort in Hawaii in 1967.

The American Eye Study Club is composed of up to 60 Active members and more than 100 Emeritus members who have served as state, regional, national, and international leaders in our profession. Many have served as president of the American Academy of Ophthalmology and/or as a director of the American Board of Ophthalmology. Thirty or more have served as chairs of university departments of ophthalmology. Without question, our founding members would be proud of the history and course followed by this organization and its members. Whether you are an Emeritus member, established Active member, or new Active member, we are delighted that you are a part of this truly wonderful group, the American Eye Study Club!

ALBERT D. RUEDEMANN, JR. LECTURE

The Ruedemann Lecture was established in the late 1980s to honor the memory of Dr. Albert D. Ruedemann, Jr., one of the creators and founding members of the American Eye Study Club. Just as Ed Isbey, Jr. is now, Dr. Ruedemann was the driving force behind the AESC for many years and served as its Secretary-Treasurer for nine years and as its President in 1967 during his last year as an Active member. He was a brilliant and innovative clinician, surgeon, and thinker who practiced in Detroit, Michigan, where his father, also an ophthalmologist, was a Professor at Wayne State University and the first Director of the Kresge Eye Institute. Over the past 15 years, many of our profession's leading figures have delivered this lecture in Dr. Ruedemann's honor.
